

## **Standing Committees.** **(Strengthening Oversight and Law-Making)**

Committees are considered as an extension of the House and are aptly regarded as the “eyes, ears, hands and brain” of the parliament. They play a pivotal role in providing robust legislative oversight, enhancing the quality of law-making, and ensuring transparency and accountability. Through conducting in-depth scrutiny of bills, policies, and government actions, committees bring critical issues to the forefront, gather diverse perspectives, and facilitate informed decision-making.

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> Parliamentary Year, the Standing Committees of Provincial Assembly of Balochistan continued to discharge these critical functions effectively. In the year, a total of 28 Bills were referred to the respective Standing Committees for detailed scrutiny and examination in accordance with the Rules of Procedure and the Constitution. Out of these, 20 Bills were thoroughly examined clause-by-clause, invited input from concerned departments and stakeholders, sought legal opinions, and evaluated policy objectives. Moreover, the Bills were also checked and reviewed in the light of constitutional alignment, financial implications, and administrative feasibility and later reported back to the House, while 08 Bills remain under active consideration. These reports were adopted, resulting in the passage of the Bills and their enactment into law.

The active functioning of the Standing Committees demonstrates strengthened institutional effectiveness and reaffirms their indispensable role in ensuring transparency, accountability, bipartisan engagement, and high-quality legislation.



### Report-wise Breakup of PAC Directives/Decisions at a Glance.




## Recovery of Public Money.

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) Balochistan has become the first digitalized PAC in the region, marking a significant milestone in strengthening transparency, efficiency, and oversight in public financial management. Through the development and deployment of the PAC Information System (PACIS), the Committee has transformed its audit review and deliberation processes into a streamlined, technology-enabled workflow. The PAC Balochistan also intends to power PACIS with artificial intelligence, a feature that will enable the Committee and its Secretariat to use the system more effectively and efficiently. AI-driven capabilities will support the staff in enhancing the overall performance of the PAC and assist Committee members in making more informed and timely decisions on audit observations; however, the authority to make final judgments will always remain with the Committee itself. Continuous improvements to PACIS are underway, ensuring that the system evolves to meet emerging needs, enhances stakeholder engagement, and sets a modern benchmark for legislative accountability mechanisms across the country.

## **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) TASK FORCE.**

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Task Force in Balochistan refers to a local body or collaborative initiative in the province of Balochistan, Pakistan, focused on implementing the United Nations' 17 SDGs at the provincial level. Balochistan, being the largest province in Pakistan with unique socio-economic and environmental challenges, requires dedicated efforts to address its development issues while aligning with global sustainability goals.

### **Key Functions of the SDG Task Force in Balochistan:**

- 1. Localized SDG Strategy:** Adapting the global SDG framework to the specific needs and priorities of Balochistan, considering local challenges such as poverty, lack of infrastructure, education deficits, gender inequality, and environmental concerns.
- 2. Coordination with Stakeholders:** The task force works with local government agencies, international organizations, civil society, private sector, and community groups to implement SDG-related projects and initiatives effectively.
- 3. Monitoring & Reporting:** Tracking progress on various SDG targets within Balochistan, using data to monitor improvements or setbacks in key areas like health, education, water and sanitation, climate action, and economic growth.
- 4. Policy Advocacy:** Collaborating with provincial lawmakers and government officials to integrate SDG principles into local policies, regulations, and development plans. The task force may also work on policy reforms that facilitate sustainable development.
- 5. Resource Mobilization:** Identifying funding opportunities through national and international donors, and ensuring that resources are allocated efficiently to SDG projects.
- 6. Capacity Building:** Training local stakeholders, including government officials, NGOs, and communities, on the SDGs and how they can contribute to achieving these goals.
- 7. Public Awareness:** Educating and raising awareness among the people of Balochistan regarding the importance of SDGs and encouraging participation in sustainable practices across the province.

### **Some Key Areas for Baluchistan's SDG Focus:**

Given the province's specific challenges, SDG Task Forces in Balochistan likely focus on issues such as:

- **SDG 1: No Poverty** – Tackling high poverty rates in rural areas through economic development programs.
- **SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being** – Addressing healthcare access issues, especially in remote areas, and improving maternal and child health services.
- **SDG 4: Quality Education** – Expanding educational opportunities and improving school infrastructure, especially for girls.
- **SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation** – Addressing water scarcity and improving sanitation facilities in the region.
- **SDG 13: Climate Action** – Mitigating the effects of climate change, especially given Baluchistan’s vulnerability to droughts and desertification.

The SDG Task Force in Balochistan may also work in partnership with national SDG efforts, under the broader framework of Pakistan's commitment to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

## Strategic Plan 2024-2029.

The Provincial Assembly of Balochistan has embarked on its first comprehensive Strategic Plan, covering the years 2024 to 2029. This initiative marks a milestone in the Assembly's evolution as a modern legislature, committed to enhancing its effectiveness, efficiency, and responsiveness to the needs of citizens. Developed through extensive consultations with members of both the previous and current Assembly, as well as the Secretariat, the plan reflects a collective aspiration to strengthen democratic governance in the province. It is guided by the vision of an inclusive, peaceful, and prosperous Balochistan, and a mission centered on excellence in representation, legislation, and oversight. Core values of integrity, tolerance, inclusiveness, excellence, and transparency provide the ethical foundation for this roadmap.

The plan acknowledges the Assembly's historical journey since its establishment in 1970, recognizing both achievements and challenges.

### Strategic Objectives.

- **Enhance knowledge, capacities, resources, and facilities for quality legislation** – The Assembly aims to build strong institutional capacity for drafting and analyzing laws. This includes establishing a dedicated team of legislative drafters within the Secretariat, strengthening the Research Wing, and forging partnerships with think tanks and academic institutions. Standing Committees will be supported with specialized training and expert input to ensure bills are thoroughly scrutinized before debate. Exposure visits and training programs will connect legislators and staff with national and international best practices, ultimately raising the quality and relevance of legislation.
- **Strengthen the oversight function of the House** – Oversight is recognized as a core responsibility of the legislature, and the plan seeks to empower Standing Committees as the primary instruments of accountability. Dedicated offices and staff will be provided to committees, enabling them to organize hearings, prepare reports, and coordinate with government departments more effectively. Amendments to the Rules of Procedure will mandate timely responses from

ministries and departments, while training programs will equip legislators and staff with the knowledge needed to evaluate executive performance and ensure transparent use of public resources.

- **Improve citizen engagement, outreach, and communication for inclusive representation** – The Assembly will expand its outreach by revamping its website into a two-way communication platform, offering citizens easier access to legislative information and opportunities to provide input. Social media and traditional media will be used proactively to share updates, highlight committee proceedings, and invite public participation in oversight and legislative processes. Special guides for citizens, youth, and children will be developed to demystify parliamentary work, while journalists and civil society will be engaged to strengthen democratic dialogue and accountability.
- **Modernize institutional systems, processes, and staff skills** – Institutional modernization will be pursued through investment in IT infrastructure, including a digital library, intranet platform, and upgraded communication systems. Staff development will be prioritized, with training programs designed to enhance technical and managerial skills. The Assembly will also review its organizational structure and Rules of Procedure to ensure efficiency and adaptability. Exposure to national and international parliamentary practices will help legislators and staff adopt innovative approaches, ensuring that the Assembly evolves into a high-performing institution capable of meeting the demands of modern governance.

## **Amendments in the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business, 1974.**

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> Parliamentary Year, significant efforts were undertaken to modernize and strengthen the institutional framework governing the functioning of the House and its committees. In this regard, a comprehensive review of the Provincial Assembly of Balochistan, Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business 1974, was initiated to align the Rules with contemporary parliamentary requirements and to ensure smoother and more effective conduct of business.

Recognizing the need to harmonize the existing Rules with modern legislative practices and evolving governance standards, the Leader of the Opposition formally submitted notice proposing 37 amendments to the Rules. These amendments aimed to improve procedural clarity, enhance legislative efficiency, strengthen oversight mechanisms, and ensure better management of House and committees' proceedings.

Upon presentation in the House, the proposed amendments were referred to the relevant committee for detailed examination and consideration. The Committee, based on the comparative-analysis, undertook a thorough and consultative review process, carefully analyzing each proposed amendment in light of constitutional provisions, established parliamentary traditions, and comparative best practices. The Committee held multiple deliberative sessions, examined the objectives and implications of each proposal, and ensured that the recommendations were balanced and served the broader interest of institutional strengthening. After comprehensive scrutiny and detailed discussion, the Committee finalized its report and submitted it to the House.

Subsequently, the House deliberated upon the Committee's report and unanimously approved all 31 proposed amendments, as originally recommended. The adoption of these amendments marks a significant milestone in the procedural evolution of the Assembly and demonstrates the collective commitment of both Treasury and Opposition members toward institutional reform and improved governance.

These amendments are expected to contribute substantially to better regulation of proceedings, more efficient transaction of legislative business, and the strengthening of parliamentary democracy within the province.

## **Capacity-Building Programs for Parliamentarians.**

A continuous and sustained capacity building is crucial for the effective functioning of any legislative institution. During the 2<sup>nd</sup> Parliamentary Year, the Balochistan Provincial Assembly, under the leadership of the Hon'ble Speaker, undertook significant international parliamentary engagements to enhance its institutional capacity. Delegations visited various European Parliaments, focusing on comparative legislative procedures, committee systems, financial oversight mechanisms, digital parliamentary transformation, and public participation models. These visits contributed to modernizing parliamentary practices and strengthening the Assembly's understanding of global best practices.

Also, a delegation participated in the 68<sup>th</sup> Commonwealth Parliamentary Conference (CPC) in Barbados (Caribbean) from 5-12 October 2025, engaging with Commonwealth legislators on democratic governance, transparency, climate change, gender equality, and institutional development. The participation provided a platform for sharing best practices and strengthening inter-parliamentary cooperation.

These capacity-building initiatives have enhanced the ability to perform its legislative and oversight functions effectively.
